Confused about whether to speak to your CLA Adviser or your Major Adviser? Here's list of reasons to contact your Major Adviser:

Speak to your Major Adviser to...

- Decide if your major is a good choice for you
- Declare your major and map out the courses you need to complete its requirements

- Continue to build upon your understanding of the expectations and requirements of the major (at least ONE yearly meeting is recommended)
  - Evaluate transfer courses for major credit
  - Enrich your major through participation in study abroad, student organizations and events in your major department
  - Further your exploration of your major field by doing independent research, internships or other special options for major credit
  - Gain information about certain courses or faculty within that department
  - Plan for graduate studies, professional school and careers associated with your major

Looking for Study Abroad money for POST-bachelor's degree study? Apply for a Fulbright Grant for 2009-10. This federally supported program enables approximately 1500 American college graduates per year to study, conduct research, pursue creative work, or assist in English language classrooms abroad in more than 140 countries worldwide. The grants support round-trip travel, living expenses, health and accident insurance, and in some cases full or partial tuition. Applicants must be U.S. citizens, must hold a bachelor's degree or equivalent by the beginning of the grant period, and should have strong academic records. U of M applicants must submit a complete application, online and in hard copy, by September 8 for the campus review and interview process. Applicants who submit the online application by August 8 may have their applications reviewed and may receive feedback from a campus Fulbright advisor. Students are encouraged to contact the appropriate Fulbright Program Advisor for further information and guidance. Thinking about the upcoming Presidential Election?

INTRODUCTION TO ELECTION ADMINISTRATION. Tuesday/Thursday, 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Humphrey Center 15; PA 3990 (class number 96841) or PA 5990 (class number 85026)  
 American elections often pit competing candidates. After voters cast their ballots, however, we expect all the votes to be counted and to be counted fairly. Recent presidential elections -- notably, the contests in Florida in 2000 and Ohio in 2004 -- revealed major breakdowns that led to complaints of bias and unfairness. As we head into the 2008 elections, unsettling questions remain about the legitimacy of our election system. This course examines how elections are actually conducted. This is course is ideal for anyone interested in elections, voting systems, and voter fraud. It is taught by one of the state's leading election administrators, Rachel Smith.
